Since 1999, this Initiative served as a unique tri-lateral inter-governmental program (financed by USAID) aimed at sharing best practices of Poland's successful transition from a centrally planned economy to a liberal, market-oriented democracy.

Enriched by PAUCI financial and technical assistance, more than 460 Polish and Ukrainian organizations have conducted some 220 partnership projects and activities influencing key areas of civil society and free-market development.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY

Project title: Reduction of energy consumption in hospital buildings in Voznesensk City

Dates: From 29/12/2014 to 29/06/2019

Key frame: SEAP implementation in Voznesensk City (Mykolayiv oblast, Ukraine).

- To display the Covenant of Mayors opportunities, as an effective mechanism of project implementation in Ukraine.
- To reduce energy consumption up to 62% in one project of retrofit of 2 hospital buildings, reduce CO2 emissions up to 22 t/year.
- To generate a share of renewable energy for one hospital building.

Project objectives:

- To make retrofit of 2 hospital buildings of Voznesensk City hospital (policlinic and children podiatry building)
- Residents of Voznesensk city and other cities Mykolayivska oblast gets knowledge about: energy savings; optimal ways to reduction energy consumption; good example of equipment selection and building thermomodernization.
- Involving of interns from Voznesensk professional school to get practice of building thermomodernization.
- Opening Energy Savings Resource Center to carry out the information campaign in the Voznesensk City.

Activities:

- Energy audit of 2 buildings, measurement and verification.
- Establishment of energy management for buildings;
- Replacement of electricity supply system of 2 buildings;
- New LED light installation for 2 buildings;
- Reduction of water consumption in buildings by changing water tanks, taps, aerators;
- Modernization of the ventilation system and installing recuperation system;
- Total replacement of heating system in two buildings;
- New energy efficient windows and doors inslattling;
- Thermal insulation of facades and attic floors;
- Installation and adjustment of solar collectors for the building.
- Information campaign about energy efficiency and energy savings oriented to hospital visitors and staff;
- Internship from Voznesensk professional school get practical experience of buildings modernization: electricity, lights and thermal insulation of facades.
